LETTER FROM NANCY





On January 6, 2021, our nation was rattled by insurgents attempting to prevent the peaceful transition of power, a first in our country's history. It was a startling reminder that our democracy is not set in stone and must be protected from those who will fight to seize power by any means necessary.

Though they failed that day, they have not given up. In 2021, the anti-voter extremists shifted their focus to the states, including our great state of Michigan, to change the rules and rig the next elections in their favor by making it harder for people to exercise their fundamental right to vote.

A healthy and vibrant democracy demands an inclusive and engaged electorate where voters are an integral part of government decision-making and public policy. VNP staff and volunteers worked diligently in 2021 to make sure that Michiganders had every opportunity to draw political boundaries that represent the communities where they live and not the interests of politicians and special interest groups. We also fought against anti-voter legislation and a petition drive that would make it harder for Michigan voters to cast their ballot.

I am proud of the work that our staff and volunteers accomplished in 2021. Michiganders successfully ungerrymandered our State Legislative and Congressional maps. In 2021, Voters Not Politicians' programming was laser focused on protecting the freedom to vote from anti-voter extremists working in the state legislature and in the field.

Freedom to Vote

Fighting for a Fundamental Right

Voters Not Politicians built a massive volunteer program to engage hundreds of thousands of people in Michigan to take direct, pro-voter action to stop the anti-voter effort in the State Capitol and in the field.

VNP mobilized Dial for Democracy volunteers, who made over 800 calls to state legislators to stop an anti-voter package of 39 bills in the Michigan Legislature by putting pressure on elected officials through press and grassroots lobbying. Additionally, VNP sounded the alarm in state and national press while VNP volunteers submitted 23 letters to the editor to raise the issue in local media outlets across the state, successfully putting the spotlight on the Michigan Legislature.

Meanwhile, the anti-voter "Secure MI Vote" moved forward with the anti-democratic "Indirect Initiative Statute" process on September 2, 2021, exploiting a quirk in Michigan law that would allow them to collect just 340,047 signatures and submit the petition to the Republican-controlled Michigan legislature for passage directly into law, circumventing the Governor and the voters.

VNP staff and volunteers quickly realized that the summary provided by Secure MI Vote was misleading and did not accurately reflect the policies in the petition. VNP responded swiftly by alerting our volunteers and providing alternative language that more accurately described the content of the petition. Volunteers submitted 57 comments to the State Board of Canvassers. As a result, the Board of State Canvassers approved a summary that was much more objective and highlighted that voters who were not able to comply with the new requirements proposed by Secure MI Vote would not have their vote counted -- a critical point that Voters Not Politicians and allies pushed for.

VNP had been ready and preparing its field team all summer in advance of the petition announcement. We had a ballot question committee in place and began grassroots fundraising upon the announcement of the petition. We added over 400 volunteers for Declineto-Sign field actions and trained volunteers on de-escalation tactics.

Committment to DEI

In 2021, Voters Not Politicians contracted with a Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion consultant, Amber Joiner-Hill of Magnolia Detroit and created a DEI steering committee. Under the guidance of Magnolia Detroit, the steering committee set specific goals and objectives with deadlines. We expect to complete all of these objectives ahead of our self-imposed deadlines.

Voters Not Politicians' journey to end gerrymandering started with a facebook post in November 2016, when a group of internet strangers, all political novices, came together to take on gerrymandering in Michigan. Our group quickly grew from hundreds to thousands of volunteers who came from a variety of backgrounds – from retirees and students to veterinarians and lawyers, young and old, of different political stripes.

Against the odds, our citizen-led campaign ended gerrymandering with the overwhelming approval of Michigan voters (61%) on November 6, 2018.

VNP continues to defend and promote policies that strengthen democracy. Michigan's government must truly represent the will of the people, all votes must count equally, and all voices must be heard. Our representatives must not be unduly influenced by lobbyists or special interests or motivated by personal gain.
